RESIDENCY DESCRIPTION

Kings Pharmacy has been an established independent pharmacy in the Brooklyn area for over 60 years. Patient satisfaction is the pharmacy's number 1 goal. Kings includes a highly professional staff of pharmacists that are specially trained and certified in disease state management. We currently have an ADA recognized Diabetes Management program, cardiovascular risk assessment & education program, and Hepatitis C education program and medication therapy management.

In addition, Kings has a compounding department that has the ability to provide IV, oral and veterinary compounds. Our program provides an array of opportunities to the profession of pharmacy. Kings has a conference room where private patient counseling and disease state management programs are held for patients several times a month.
